Speaker : Dr Nouchine Hadjikhani

Dr. Nouchine Hadjikhani is Associate Professor in Radiology at Harvard Medical School, Assistant in Radiology at Massachusetts General Hospital, Affiliated Faculty at Harvard-MIT-HST, and Professeur Boursier at the Brain and Mind Institute at EPFL in Switzerland. She was born and raised in Switzerland, where she obtained her MD in 1992. After completing her thesis in 1995, Dr. Hadjikhani spent her first postdoctoral year at the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm doing vision studies using PET. She then came to Boston, where she has been doing functional MRI studies at the Martinos Center. Last year, she also started a lab centered on autism studies at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology. Her two current research interests, autism and migraine, both stem from her initial work in visual system.

Learning Goals:

1. Recognize the symptom diversity of autism spectrum disorders (ASD).
2. Discuss results from imaging studies highlighting similarities and differences in autistic brains.
3. Assess new perspectives on autism research.
