David J. Libon, Ph.D. received his Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Rhode Island in 1985 and received training in clinical neuropsychology at the Boston VA Medical Center from 1984-1985. Dr. Libon is the past Supervising Neuropsychologist at the Philadelphia Geriatric Center and past Director of Neuropsychology at Crozer-Chester Medical Center. Dr. Libon has been associated with the Drexel University Ph.D. program in neuropsychology for many years. In 1998-1999 Dr. Libon served as Interim Graduate Director of the Drexel psychology program. The National Academy of Neuropsychology (NAN) recognized Dr. Libon's research on vascular dementia by conferring the Nelson Butters Award in 1998. Currently, Dr. Libon is Associate Professor of Psychiatry (Neuropsychology) at the New Jersey Institute for Successful Aging, University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey-School of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Libon's research interests have focused on the brain-behavior relationships associated with executive control and working memory deficits in dementia with a special interest in vascular dementia. Dr. Libon's presentation will focus on what neuropsychological assessment can tell us about the brain-behavior relationships that underlie executive and working memory deficits associated with dementia syndromes such as Alzheimer's disease, Vascular Dementia, and Huntington Disease.
